AFRWG Agenda Item 1: Action taken report by Chair¹

1. The Chair will present the report on the actions taken on the decisions and proposals of the working group at its last meeting held in November 2023.

2. **Reactivation of National Committees**: The ICID Central Office contacted the Mauritania, Togolese Republic, and Mozambique, for the reactivation of their country membership however, the response is still awaited.

3. The chair in consultation with the Vice Chair, Secretary of the WG, and the Central Office has updated the membership of the WG as given in **Annex 1** (*refer electronic version for the latest list*). New nominations, if any, for the membership received, will be dealt with suitably after the meeting.

AFRWG Agenda Item 2: Road Map to ICID Vision 2030 – Status of activities in the African region

4. During the India meeting in 2023, the group noted that all the activities of the group are going well in line with the ICID Vision 2030 and Chair Dr. Wahba informed that AFRWG will continue its activities according to the Road Map to ICID Vision 2030 (refer to **Annex 2**), as follows:

- Goal B: to be a catalyst for change policies and practices (the final draft position paper on green evolution in Africa was presented and circulated to the AFRWG members for review)
- Goal C: Facilitate the exchange of information, knowledge, and technology (share and circulate all available documents, reports, news updates, and other documents to all using the ICID website, LinkedIn, and WhatsApp groups)
- Goal F: Facilitate Capacity Development (webinar, 6th Af-YWP Forum, online courses, webinars, training workshops, and study tours upon request of NCs)

5. During the Australia meeting, the group members may like to discuss and update the Road Map to ICID Vision 2030. Chair will provide further updates at the meeting.

AFRWG Agenda Item 3: Progress on Position paper on Green Revolution in Africa

6. During the India meeting, the Chair informed the group that the paper has already been published in the WWP Journal and a copy of the paper is available on the AFRWG webpage at https://icidciid.org/icid_data_web/Researcharticle2023.pdf. Members can access the link and download the paper. Chair will provide further updates at the meeting.

AFRWG Agenda Item 4: Updates on Regional Irrigation Associations- SARIA, ARID-RAID

7. During the India meeting, Mr. Winston Sataya, the Chair of SARIA provided a brief report of the workshop held on 9th October 2023 wherein seven member countries participated (*South Africa, Zimbabwe, Zambia, Malawi, Madagascar, Mauritius, and DRC*). He further informed that SARIA will be organizing a Symposium in

2024. In February 2024, ICID Central Office requested Mr. Winston Sataya to provide further updates of the Symposium however, response is awaited. SARIA representative will provide further updates at the meeting.

AFRWG Agenda Item 5: Progress for the proposed third node for IRPID for the African region

8. During the India meeting, VP Prof. Dr. Sylvester Mpandeli informed the group that a node by South African NC has been established. The South African National Committee on Irrigation and Drainage (SANCID) and the Water Research Commission (WRC) of South Africa are coordinating the IRPID activities. A workshop was organized on 26 April 2023 to launch the IRPID activities in Southern Africa. All Southern African countries were invited to attend the launch of the IRPID node. Dr. Sylvester Mpandeli will provide further updates at the meeting.

AFRWG Agenda Item 6: Af-YWPeF - Program and future activities

- 9. During the November 2023 meeting, the group proposed the following activities:
 - > At least two webinars will be organized during next year
 - > To organize the 7th African Young Professional Forum
 - More MoUs will be signed with different international institutions and partners to support the activities of Capacity Development and Building of young professionals and the exchange and dissemination of advanced technologies in the field of water, irrigation, drainage, and all related fields.
 - > Daily communications with YPs for technical support and advice, recommendation letters, sharing news updates, bulletin, reports, announcements, available reports, online activities, opportunities, and others.
- 10. The Chair may like to provide further updates at the meeting.

AFRWG Agenda Item 7: 7th African Young Professional Forum and Cairo Water Week 2024, 13-17 October 2024, Egypt

11. The Cairo Water Week will be held from 13–17 October 2024 on the theme "Water and Climate: Building Resilient Communities" with the following sub-themes - (1) Transboundary Water Governance for Sustainable Development; (2) Strategic Water Resources Management in Enhancing Community Resilience; (3) Innovation and Financing Resilient Solutions for Water Security; (4) Actions for Water and Climate Adaptations and Resilience; and (5) Climate-Smart Communities Planning and Legislation. The Chair may like to provide further updates at the meeting.

AFRWG Agenda Item 8: 6th African Regional Conference on Irrigation and Drainage, 14-18 April 2025, Nigeria

12. The 6th African Regional Conference with the main theme "Tackling Irrigation Development and Water Management Crisis in Africa" will be held from 14-18 April 2025 in Abuja, Nigeria. In addition to the three-day African Regional Conference, NINCID is organizing a one-day National Irrigation and Drainage Symposium with the theme: "Participatory Irrigation Management for Sustainable Rural Development, Economic Growth and Food Security" with a possible partnership with World Bank (TRIMMING PROJECT); and a half-day High-level Policy Dialogue to bring together key political actors, business leaders, NGOs, donors, and top water managers to dialogue on "Achieving SDGs in the context of prevailing Transboundary water resources governance in Africa".

13. The Nigerian National Committee on Irrigation and Drainage (NINCID) in collaboration with the Federal Ministry of Water Resources and Sanitation (FMWR&S) through the Department of Irrigation and Drainage (DID) organized a 5-Day Workshop and Annual General Meeting of NINCID from 3-8 December 2023 at Kano City, Kano State wherein 265 participants attended the Workshop. The main focus of the Workshop was for the Stakeholders to discuss progress, and emerging issues and extend the way forward in the Irrigation and Drainage Subsector as well as to deliberate on hosting the 6th African Regional Conference.

14. A representative from NINCID will provide further updates on the Conference at the meeting.

AFRWG Agenda Item 9: Any other business (with permission of Chair)

15. **ICID Members' Profile Section:** As a new initiative, ICID has launched a new website (https://icid-ciid.org) as part of ICID's 70th Anniversary Celebration to meet the new web technologies. One of the newly added web features provides WG members access to their profile section using their dedicated account. ICID CO vide email dated 9 July 2021 <https://icid.bmeurl.co/C7D4D2E> informed all members on how to access their accounts and change their passwords to maintain accuracy. Members are requested to review and update their information

using their credentials and help us to maintain accurate information. For more information, please refer to inside back cover page.

16. World Irrigation and Drainage Schemes (WI&DS): ICID has taken the initiative to document the development of irrigation and drainage schemes in the world by establishing an online Register on "World Irrigation and Drainage Schemes (WI&DS)". WI&DS will fulfil the need for a much-awaited global repository of information in systematic irrigation and agricultural water management. Irrigation projects having 5000 Hectares and above of Command Area can submit their information for inclusion in the register. The irrigation projects approved by National Committee/ ICID Central Office for inclusion are entitled to Certification. Chair will encourage members to urge all irrigation and drainage scheme owners, managers, and researchers across the world and especially in their respective countries for contributing to the register. The review process and other details are outlined on the portal < https://wip.icidevents.org/ > in detail.
