Dr Lim Wee Shiong

A/Prof Lim Wee Shiong is the Director at Institute of Geriatrics and Active Aging, and Senior Consultant at the Department of Geriatric Medicine, TTSH. He is Adjunct Associate Professor at Yong Loo Lin School of Medicine, NUS and Lee Kong Chian School of Medicine, NTU.

His comprehensive track record of scholarly work includes over 160 peer-reviewed publications; editorial board member of international journals; and co-author of the highly-cited Asian Working Group for Sarcopenia (AWGS) 2019 consensus. Research interests include sarcopenia and related disorders; frailty and intrinsic capacity; cognition-related disorders; caregiving; and evidence-based medicine in the older adult.



Dr Chionh Siok Bee

Dr Chionh Siok Bee was the past President of the Osteoporosis Society Singapore and a member of the International Society of Densitometry Asia-Pacific Committee. She plays an active role in patient safety as Chair of the Clinical Directors' Committee and Associate Chairman, Medical Board (Quality and Patient Safety), NUH.

Dr Chionh obtained her medical qualifications from University College Cork, National University of Ireland, the Royal College of Physicians (Edinburgh), the Royal Australasian College of Physicians and trained in Endocrinology at the Royal Prince Alfred Hospital (Sydney).

Dr Joyce Koh is a senior consultant orthopaedic surgeon with the Trauma Service, Dept of Orthopaedic Surgery, Singapore General Hospital with subspecialty interests in Upper Extremity and Orthogeriatric Trauma. She previously co-chaired the Singhealth Hip Fracture Bundled Payment Workgroup and works closely with Singhealth, Duke-NUS and the Ministry of Health, Singapore to drive value-driven care initiatives. Research interests include Geriatric trauma with specific interests in atypical femur fractures.

Dr Rani Ramason is a Senior Consultant in Geriatric Medicine in Tan Tock Seng Hospital with an interest in Falls Prevention. She also runs the Orthogeriatric Service in TTSH managing older hip fracture patients. She was the Co-director of MOH - HSDP funded - Integrated Hip Fracture Program (2011- 2016) and subsequently TTSH Co - director of MOH Hip Fracture Bundled Program (2016 -2019).

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
