The management of hormone-sensitive prostate cancer (HSPC) has evolved rapidly, with advances in systemic therapy improving outcomes and reshaping contemporary standards of care.

As treatment options continue to expand, clinicians are faced with increasingly complex decisions around guideline implementation, patient selection, treatment initiation, and the ongoing management of therapy.

This multidisciplinary breakfast session will bring together experts in urology, medical oncology and uro-oncology nursing to explore the practical aspects of delivering systemic treatment in HSPC.

Faculty will review current guideline recommendations, discuss which patients are most likely to benefit from systemic therapy and when treatment should be initiated, and share practical approaches to managing androgen receptor pathway inhibitors (ARPIs) while supporting patients throughout their treatment journey.

Through expert presentations and an interactive panel discussion, participants will gain practical, evidence-based insights into integrating contemporary systemic therapies into routine clinical practice and optimising multidisciplinary care for men with HSPC.
