Dos and Don'ts:


- Do take the time to explore Australia's nature.
- Do chat with the locals Australians are generally friendly, laid back and happy to lend a helping hand.
- Do admire our animals but from a safe distance.
- Do be respectful of parks, monuments and natural attractions which may be important spiritual sites.
- Do make sure to check out the local food, art and shopping scenes! For more details see the 'Places to go and things to see' section on the following page.
- Do take care when swimming. In the city it is recommended to swim in the man-made lagoon on the Esplanade. In the rest of Australia it is always ideal to swim between the flags.
- Don't go swimming with the crocodiles! Crocodiles are known to frequent the beaches in the city, so stick to the beaches in the northern suburbs. Always observe signage for the surrounding bodies of water as may be unsafe to swim in.
- Don't forget to wear sunscreen, sunnies (sunglasses) and a hat!
- Don't forget to drive on the left side of the road.
- Don't litter, throw rubbish in the public bins provided. Remember we recycle!
- Don't forget to stay hydrated!

Transport Options:

- The main form of transport in Cairns are buses. A 'go' card is required and can be purchased from any convenience store. The public bus service (Sunbus) operates throughout the city and suburbs. More information can be found on https://translink.com.au/.
- There are currently no trains going to and from the airport, however, there are private shuttle services from Cairns Airport to the CBD and Palm Cove.

- Uber is available throughout most of Australia.

Cairns in winter is very mild with low humidity. Temperatures range between 17-26°C (63.5-78.8°F), with the nights getting a bit cool. Make sure to pack a jacket!
