This interactive session will provide context as it relates to the sector's struck-by trends, as well as emerging hazards observed in greenhouses. Participants will also engage in small group discussions to identify the struck-by hazards in their workplace and collaboratively develop actionable plans to address these risks. You will leave with practical applications to start implementing in your greenhouse.

Leading cause of LTIs in greenhouses are slips, trips and falls. This session will provide concerning statistics on these incidents, explore the root causes of these hazards and how to avoid incidents from occurring. Together, we will discuss real-life examples of controls for these hazards, review the latest fall protection devices and share resources that can help you implement safer work processes. This session will equip you with the information and tools necessary to enhance fall prevention in your greenhouse.
