Join us on the final day on a journey to discover Batu Caves & Masjid Jamek Mosque.

Batu Caves is a mogote that has a series of caves and cave temples in Gombak, Selangor, Malaysia. It takes its name from the Malay word batu, meaning 'rock'.

The cave complex is one of the most popular Hindu shrines outside of India, and is dedicated to Murugan (the Hindu god of war). The complex hosts a 43 m (141 ft) high Murugan statue, one of the largest Murugan statues in the world.

Climbing the 272 Batu Caves rainbow stairs is worth the effort but wear comfortable shoes with good grip, and drink water to stay hydrated as it can be hot and humid.

Masjid Jamek Mosque, officially Sultan Abdul Samad Jamek Mosque is one of the oldest mosques in Kuala Lumpur. The mosque was built in 1909 by Sultan Abdul Samad and

remains the city's central house of worship for the Muslim community. Visitors are requested to avoid making loud noises and show reverence for this place of worship.

Both the Batu Caves and the Masjid Jamek Mosque are places of worship and therefore appropriate attire is required. Both men and women must cover their shoulders and knees. Avoid wearing shorts, skirts or dresses above the knees, sleeveless tops, or clothing that exposes too much skin. In the Mosque, non-Muslim female visitors may be asked to wear a headscarf before entering and both men and women can be asked to wear robes. All shoes should be removed.

Lunch will take place at the Old Precious China restaurant en route back to the hotel.
