A word on the concept of the 2025 Social Program



WEDNESDAY 3 SEPTEMBER

Nairobi City Sightseeing Coach Tour & National Museum for All 2.00 – 5.00 pm US \$60

Pick up from the Trademark Hotel for a Nairobi sightseeing tour by coach, including a guided visit to the Nairobi National Museum. Get a feel for the energy and scale of Nairobi with a drive through the Central Business District, passing key landmarks such as Uhuru Park, the Parliament buildings and the Kenyatta International Conference Centre (KICC). We will hope for no traffic jams, but be relaxed if there are, and the tour will conclude with a guided tour of the iconic National Museum, which is the home of Turkana Boy. With seven permanent galleries, the Museum is the ideal place to explore Kenya's rich history, diverse cultures, nature and artistic heritage - a highlight for Rachael is the Cradle of Human kind Exhibition, which holds the most important collection in the world of early human fossils, and where you can see a cast of Turkana Boy.

THURSDAY 4 SEPTEMBER

Opportunity Factory Tour & Karen Blixen Museum for Accompanying Guests and Non-Practicing Fellows 10.45 am - 3.30 pm US \$146

Morning pick-up from the Trademark Hotel and transfer to the Opportunity Factory for a guided walking tour. This dynamic centre empowers youth through skill development and sustainable economic growth, creating meaningful employment opportunities. The vibrant hub showcases craft, creativity, and culture allowing visitors to engage in hands-on activities such as beading, leather stitching, ceramic sculpture, screen printing, stained-glass making, and crafting unique bucket hats.

In the afternoon, after stopping for lunch we will head to the Karen Blixen Museum which was once the centre piece of a farm at the foot of the Ngong Hills owned by Danish author Karen and her Swedish husband, Baron Bror Blixen-Finecke. Located 10km from the city centre, the museum belongs to a different time period in the history of Kenya, and later gained international acclaim with the release of the movie 'Out of Africa', an Oscar winning film based on Karen's autobiography of the same title.

Lunch at the charming restaurant Under the Swahili Tree is included in the tour cost.

Dress Code: Comfortable clothing and shoes. Closed-toe shoes or comfortable walking sandals are ideal as you will be walking around the museum, don't forget sunscreen and a hat.

A short bus ride from the hotel, and nestled in the Karura Forest in the suburb of Kitisuru, Ankole Grill offers an authentic dining experience with true African hospitality. FRIDAY 5 SEPTEMBER

Nairobi National Park Game Drive for All 5.30 am – 2.30 pm US \$273

Early morning pick-up from the hotel for a morning game drive at Nairobi National Park (located only 10km outside of the city's central business district) where the wide-open grass plains and scattered acacia bush provide a stunning contrast to the city's skyline. Enjoy breathtaking views as you explore this unique wildlife sanctuary, home to lions, rhinos, giraffes, zebras, impala and a huge variety of other species. It will be well worth the early morning alarm call!

Kindly Note:

Wear comfortable, neutral-coloured clothing suitable for a safari; bright clothes are not considered suitable as they disturb the animals. Layering is recommended to adapt to the cool morning breeze and the daytime heat. Essentials include long-sleeve shirts, a warm jacket, trousers, comfortable shoes, sunscreen, a hat, camera with a zoom lens and binoculars for optimal wildlife viewing.

The cost includes a boxed breakfast, a four-hour 4x4 Safari Land cruiser tour with qualified English-speaking driver guides and a stop for lunch at the Karen Blixen Coffee Garden en route back to the hotel.

FRIDAY 5 SEPTEMBER

AFEW Giraffe Centre Tour for All 10.00 am – 2.30 pm US \$113

This tour is offered for those who may not wish to do the game drive. The tour will finish with lunch at the Karen Blixen Coffee Garden where you will meet up with those who have been on the Game Drive.

The tour includes a visit to the <u>AFEW Giraffe Centre</u> (located only 15 Km from Nairobi's city centre) with an English-speaking guide, and lunch at the Karen Blixen Coffee Garden.

The Giraffe Centre Sanctuary is the creation of the African Fund for Endangered Wildlife (AFEW Kenya), a Kenyan non-profit organization, set up to educate people on the country's wildlife and environment, as well as to give visitors an opportunity to come into close contact with the world's tallest species, the giraffe. AFEW Kenya's main purpose is to create an educational institution in conjunction with rescuing the giraffe. Those of you who have seen the homemade video for the meeting will have seen Annie getting very friendly with the giraffe, when feeding them!

Dress Code:

Comfortable Clothing & Shoes: Closed-toe shoes or comfortable walking sandals are ideal, as you will be walking around the Giraffe Centre on the raised platform while feeding the Giraffes. We recommend you wear sunscreen and a hat.

Karura Forest Reserve & David Sheldrick's Elephant Orphanage Tour for Accompanying Guests and Non-Practicing Fellows

The tour will start with a guided two-hour walk through the Karura Forest Reserve, an urban upland forest on the outskirts of Nairobi. The remarkable geographical location of this natural resource, reputedly one of the largest forests in the world within a city's boundaries, is a shining example of how country-based corporate social responsibility and individual philanthropy can serve to secure and protect a country's natural resources.

We will then travel by coach to The Sheldrick Wildlife Trust (SWT) which is world-renowned for its work rescuing and rehabilitating orphaned baby elephants. The SWT Nursery, located in Nairobi National Park, is where an elephant orphan's journey begins; a journey that will culminate, several years down

the line, in their reintegration back into the wild. This is a one-hour walking visit. You will get to see the elephants having their breakfast, and, if you are lucky, some young rescued rhinos too.

Please wear appropriate footwear and clothing for the outdoor setting. It can be hot and sunny so we advise guests to wear sunscreen and a hat.
