HRM delivers hundreds of different report types from more than 500 hospital and specialty clinic sites to your EMR so you don't have to handle paper reports. HRM sends almost 4 million reports to clinicians per month. It made sense to leverage this powerful digital tool to deliver reports from COVID-19 assessment centres and other COVID-19-related information.



Notifications of Positive COVID-19 Test Results

After patients are tested for COVID-19, it's important for primary care clinicians to know which patients tested positive. OMD's Health Report Manager (HRM) tool delivers notifications in your EMR inbox when a patient's test result comes back positive in the Ontario Laboratories Information System (OLIS). These notifications let you know when to check OLIS instead of checking OLIS repeatedly before the positive results are in. HRM has been delivering COVID-19 vaccination reports from the provincial COVaxON vaccination management system to your EMR since May 2021.
