# Trade Facilitation – A key pillar of SASEC

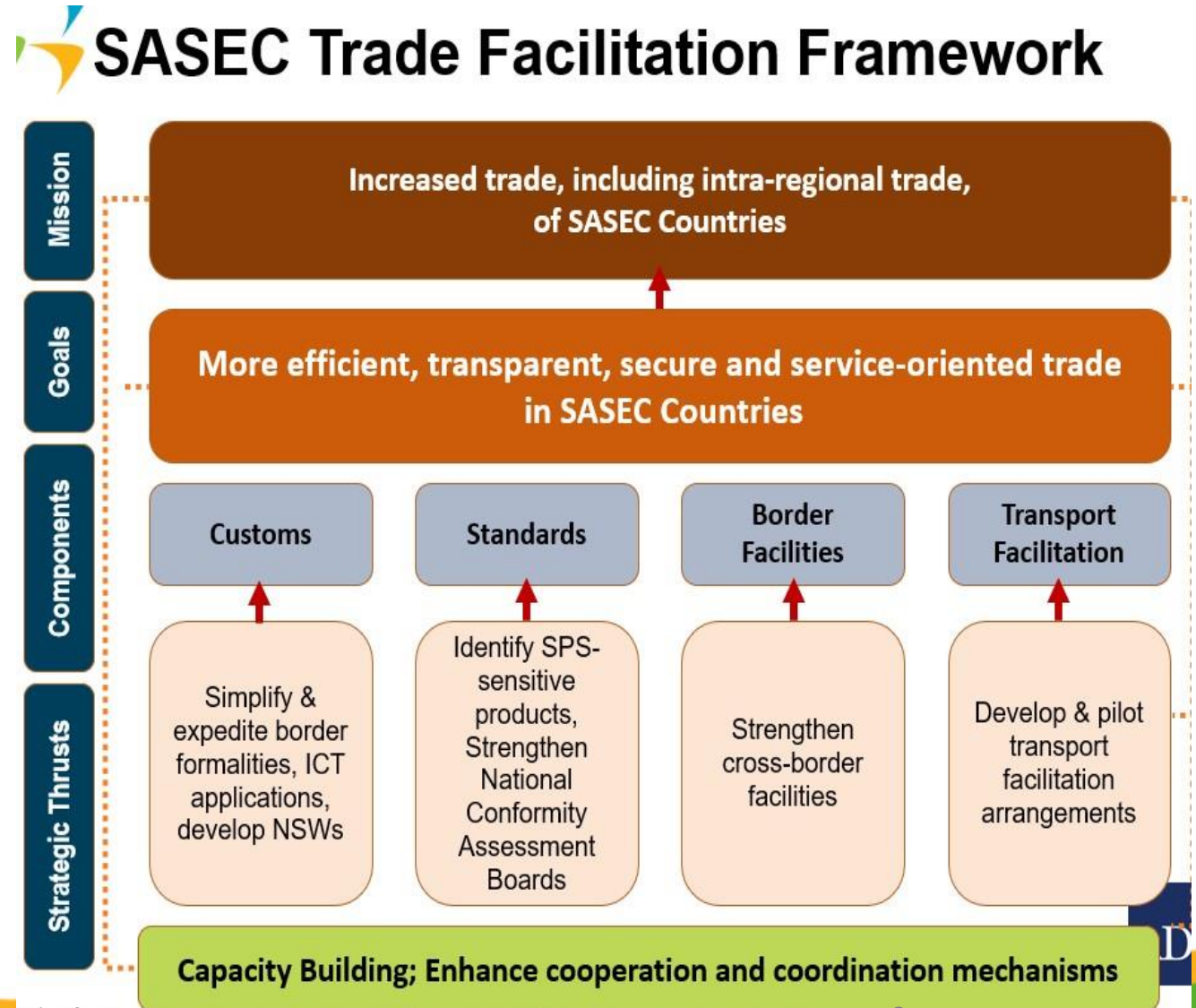
## SASEC – Common Vision

## Strategic Objective

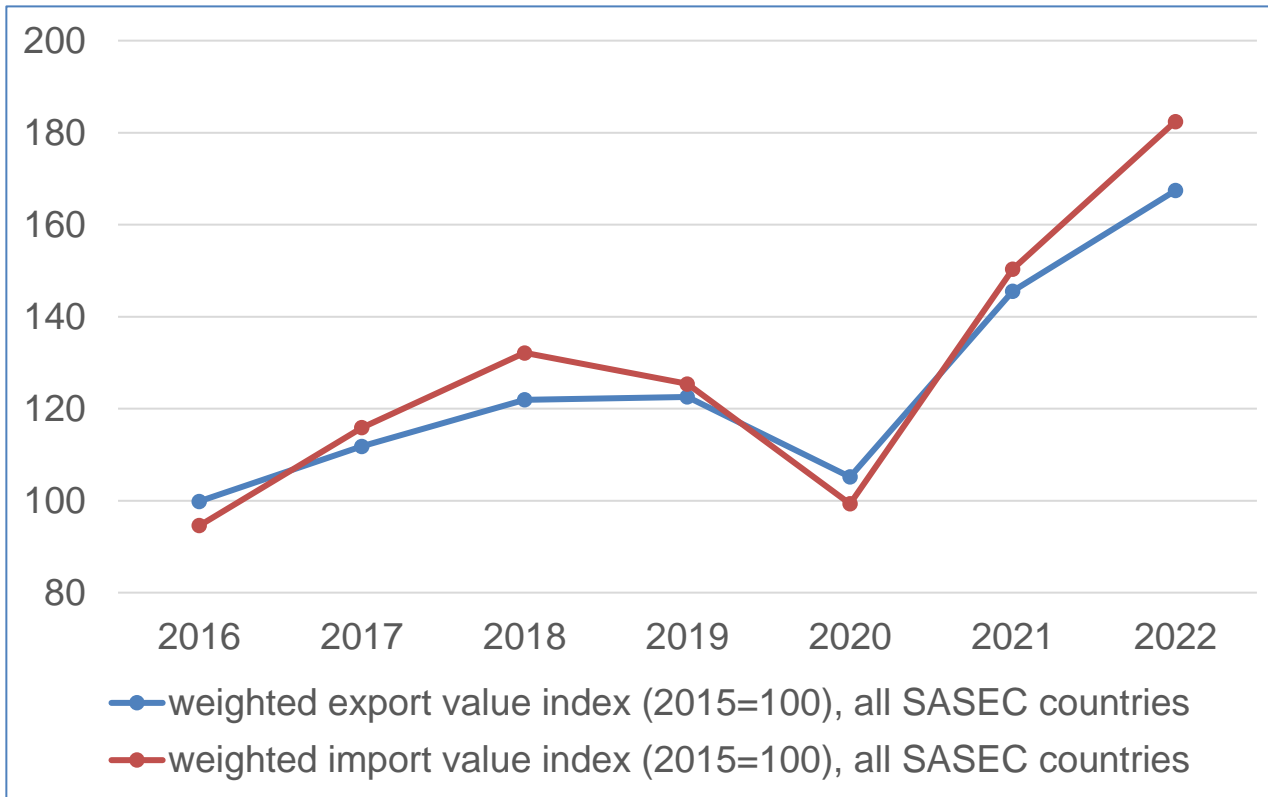
- Comprehensive approach to transport and trade facilitation,

Trade Facilitation has remained a key pillar of SASEC

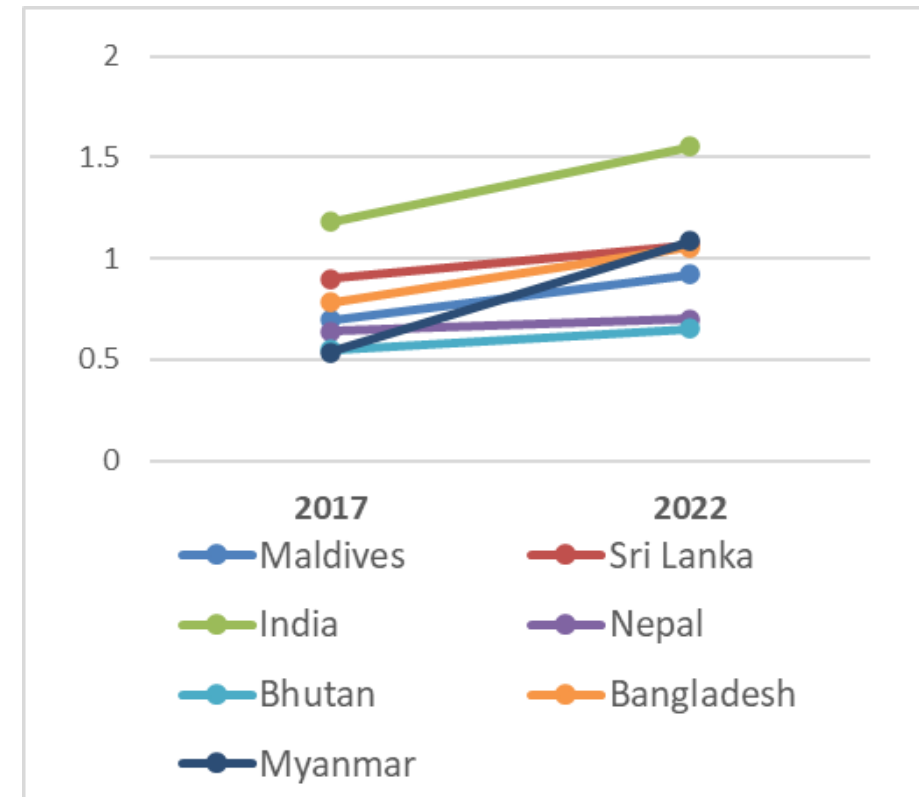


# SASEC Countries' Development under the Previous Vision (2017-2022)

# SASEC Customs Subgroup

SCS had formulated Sub Regional Projects (SRPs) to –

- Improve the facilitation of cross-border trade and transit in the SASEC subregion
- Strengthen the cooperation among SASEC customs administrations for better compliance monitoring, and
- Conduct border management in a coordinated manner.

2	Border meetings between Customs authorities
3	Electronic exchange of pre-arrival data
4	Use of Electronic Cargo Tracking System (ECTS)
5	Cross-Border Transport Facilitation Routes Initiatives

**SCS as exchange of info platform and strengthening cooperation leads to:**

- Faster assistance during disaster
- Closer coordination during pandemic
- Learning on how emerging issues mainstreamed into national Trade facilitation projects.

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# Resiliency Action - Recommendation for Business Community

## Tariffs and Fees

- Waiver and deferment, e-payment, temporary imports

## Easing formalities

- Simplified declarations, accepted copies of documents, reduced scale of physical inspections

## Digitalization

- Accepting digital uploads of supporting documents, electronic information flow among regulators/NSW, e-delivery orders

## Coordination

- Mutual recognition of controls, coordinated inspections, communication hotlines

## Assistance to SMEs

- Set up crisis teams, Helpdesks, online publication

## Operations and Staffing

- Staff counselling, border operations to be declared as essential services



# Digitalization for Trade Facilitation

Enabling legislation

Automation & Paperless process

National Single Window

E-payments

Trade Information Portals

Use of Non Intrusive equipment

Fully digitalizing regulatory procedures around trade could save between 32 and 86 kg of CO2 equivalents per end-to-end transaction.



**UNESCAP Estimates**



Scaled to trading volumes in Asia and the Pacific, this implies potential savings of 13 million tons, equivalent to planting 439 million trees!

# Progress towards Paperless Processing in SASEC

## Electronic filing – digital uploads -- data exchange

Electronic exchange of pre-arrival data between  
Customs Administrations being discussed to  
improve risk management

Exchange between National Single Windows,  
going forward



Scenario analysis\* of the impact of trade facilitation implementation  
in Asia and the Pacific revealed that:

- If paperless and cross-border paperless trade measures are implemented in addition to the WTO TFA measures, trade costs could be reduced by up to 26%.
- \* *UNESCAP - Impact of implementation of digital trade facilitation on trade costs*

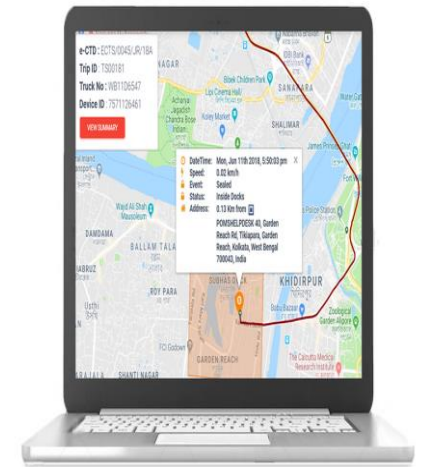


# Facilitation of Nepal Transit Cargo through India

## Before the Pilot

- Manual process
- Excessive documentation
- Delay in discharge of bonds
- Lack of visibility
- Inadequate security and monitoring capability

- Using ECTS (E-Seals with GNSS facility), and
- Web application with –
  - Provision for filing declaration & supporting documents, scrutiny and approval by customs
  - Tracking facility for regulators and other stakeholders (as per access privileges granted).
  - Dashboards for Customs officers and private sector
  - Fee payment for use of ECTS facility
