Noam Angrist

Senior Fellow, Oxford University and Founder, Youth Impact

Noam Angrist is the Academic Director of the <u>What Works Hub</u> for <u>Global Education</u> at the University of Oxford and is a cofounder of <u>Youth Impact</u>, one of the largest NGOs dedicated to scaling-up health and education programs backed by randomized trial evidence. In addition to scaling proven programs with governments, Youth Impact conducts regular, rapid A/B tests to optimize cost-effectiveness of programs on the path to scale. Angrist has published in leading academic journals ncluding *Nature*, *Nature Human Behaviour*, and the *Journal of Economic Perspectives*. Angrist has consulted for the World Bank Chief Economist, developed key components of the World Bank Human Capital Index education pillar, and co-led academic research underpinning the Global Education Evidence Advisory Panel's flagship reports. Angrist holds a PhD from the University of Oxford.
