- 1. community focus
- 2. participatory planning and design
- 3. community control of resources
- 4. community involvement in implementation
- 5. community-based participatory M&E



- CDD is a sub-set of the broader community-based development approach
- CDD approach puts control over planning decisions and investment of resources in the hands of the community
- CDD is implemented through community-based organizations and in partnership with local governments
- CDD provides resources (block grants) directly to community groups to implement the development projects of their choice.

CDD is a natural choice for building community resilience



CDD and climate action to build resilience share the common objective of tackling vulnerability

ADB

- CDD provides opportunities to address localized climate risks
- CDD allows reaching scale which is critical as climate risk increases

CDD focuses on empowering communities, which is key for building resilience
