

Lisa Elges is a human rights lawyer specializing in integrity and environmental governance. Her career began in Japan where she graduated from International Christian University and worked for the Tokyo Kyodo Law Firm, the Japanese Senate, the International Movement against All forms of Racism and Discrimination and the Asia Crime Prevention Foundation/UNAFEI.

She has her LL.M from the University of Essex and her PhD in Environmental Law and Policy at the Freie University, Berlin.

At Transparency International, Lisa led the UNCAC negotiations, projects in Asia Pacific and the Climate Finance Integrity Programme. At the Green Climate Fund Independent Integrity Unit, she became the acting prevention lead. Lisa's independent writing including her book, Stratospheric Ozone Damage and Legal Liability supports the call for public and private accountability to safeguard the global commons. She currently works as an independent consultant and is developing an NGO to support people with distress and disabilities.
