

## Workers Compensation Seminar 2025

### INTRODUCTION

This year, Both Sides of the Fence explores the practical differences between the ways that workers compensation claims are handled by self-insured employers and the Corporation's claims agents, between claims for physical injuries and psychiatric injuries, and the interaction between workers compensation claims and other employment-related litigation.

#### Bob

- Bob is a casual employee of a labourhire firm, Lotsa Labour.
- Lotsa Labour placed Bob with a host employer, Cutting Corners to perform store work.
- Bob sustained a lower back injury lifting a box.
- Lotsa Labour is self-insured for workers compensation.

#### Barb

- Barbara works for a real estate agency, Real Deals, performing administrative work.
- Barb has sustained a psychiatric injury and is off work.
- Barb is highly distressed and her relationship with Real Deals is seriously strained.
- Real Deals is registered with RTWSA.
- IDC is Real Deals' claims agent.
