



INVESTITURE OF LIFE MEMBERS



Life Member 2025:

Ms Christine Parry Axten



Christine Parry Axten is a distinguished Mental Health Nurse whose career has been defined by visionary leadership, tireless advocacy, and a deep commitment to advancing the profession. A longstanding member of the Australian College of Mental Health Nurses (ACMHN), Christine has played a pivotal role in shaping national standards and education frameworks that continue to influence mental health nursing practice today.

During her time in Darwin, Christine was a founding member of the Northern Territory branch of the ACMHN and contributed to the development of the Domains of Nursing, helping standardise nursing education across Australia. She was also involved in early discussions with the Federal Government that laid the groundwork for the nurse practitioner role.

Returning to Western Australia, Christine became an enthusiastic committee member and past secretary of the WA Branch of ACMHN, where she actively promoted membership and supports educational programs. In 1996, she established WA's first consultation liaison nursing position, generously sharing her expertise to help other hospitals adopt similar roles. Her mentorship of students in holistic care has left a lasting legacy.

Christine's passion for research-informed practice is evident in her own published work, which has been widely cited. As past chair of the Mental Health Research Committee at Alma Street Mental Health Services, she led efforts to integrate evidence-based care. She also developed an eclectic nursing model to unify diverse clinical and community teams in a newly formed mental health unit.

Her contributions span international conferences, local symposiums, workforce planning, and voluntary assisted dying legislation. Christine remains a vital resource for the future of mental health nursing, offering insight into what has worked—and what can be built upon.


Her enduring impact and unwavering dedication make her a truly worthy candidate for life membership of the ACMHN.

Life Member 2025:

Mr Jon Chesterson




Jon Chesterson began his career in the UK in 1977, trained as an NHS psychiatric nurse, general nurse and community mental health nurse at Springfield, St George's Hospitals and NEScot, University of Surrey. He came to Australia in 1988 working in public mental health services across Sydney, Canberra, Newcastle and Hunter New England in clinical, educational and leadership roles. Jon has contributed extensively to staff development, tertiary education, research and professional networks at local, national and international level. He has been in leadership roles in the ACMHN, other professional bodies, and boards in the mental health NGO sector. In 1996, Jon was appointed to the Federal Ministerial Taskforce and in 1997 became a founding board member of the Mental Health Council of Australia, now Mental Health Australia.

Jon was originally engaged overseas by the Rozelle Hospital, joined the ACMHN and elected to NSW Branch Council of the College in 1988. From 1990 to 1999, Jon worked as a Nurse Educator in ACT Health, responsible for staff development. He re-designed and delivered the post-basic psychiatric nursing course curricula, which led to registration in the ACT, accreditation by the NSW College of Nursing, and later transition to Graduate Diploma in Mental Health Nursing in collaboration with Charles Sturt University, to articulate with a Masters in Mental Health.

Throughout the 1990s, Jon was an active member of the ACT Branch and served as College Board Member 1991 to 1995. He was recognised as a Founding Fellow of the College in 1992, served as Vice-President 1994 to 1995, ACT Branch Chair 1995 to 1997, and College President 1997 to 1999. Jon convened two College international conferences which included the 21st in Canberra (1995) and the 35th in Sydney (2009). The 1995 conference, under his leadership, was the first national nursing body and conference in Australia to formally celebrate an Indigenous opening welcome ceremony.

Jon was convenor and mentor of the annual Hunter Mental Health Conference, serving on the Hunter Branch Committee for 13 years. He chaired the NSW Branch from 2006 to 2010 and worked as National Project Consultant from 1999 to 2006, developing a seminal body of work to establish the College's national credentialing program, officially launched in 2004 at the 30th Annual Conference in Canberra. He chaired the Credentialing Committee from 2006 to 2008.

Jon has convened a wide range of conferences, seminars, courses, programs and public events in mental health for the College, other organisations, agencies and health services. He served as a reviewer for six professional nursing journals, including the College's International Journal of Mental Health Nursing (IJMHN), the RCNA's Collegian, and ICN's International Nursing Review. From 1998 to 2006, Jon was ICN expert for the RCNA on Mental Health Nursing. He co-authored a book 'PRA the Story' in 2005 (a social history of mental health in NSW for the 50th anniversary of PRA/Flourish Australia), and book chapters in Barker's international 'Craft of Caring' 2003 and 2009.


He played a pivotal role in the College throughout the 1990s after a New Zealand Branch was established in 1992, becoming the ANZCMHN in leadership reforms by Professor Pierre Baume (College President 1991–1995). Jon represented the College at the National Nursing Organisations (Australia), contributing to formal collegial partnerships in Canberra with the RCNA and ACMI.

Jon was awarded Mental Health Nurse of the Year in 2011 at the 37th Annual College Conference on the Gold Coast.

Life Member 2025:

Prof Kim Foster



Professor Kim Foster is an internationally recognised mental health nurse academic and the inaugural Eileen O'Connor Chair of Mental Health Research at Australian Catholic University. With over 35 years of pioneering leadership in education and research across four Australian universities, she has made enduring contributions to mental health care and nursing workforce development. A former Board Director and Vice President of the Australian College of Mental Health Nurses (ACMHN), Kim is widely respected for her strategic vision and advocacy for the profession.

Kim's internationally renowned research focuses on two key areas: enhancing the wellbeing and resilience of the mental health and nursing workforces and addressing the needs of children and families where parents have mental illness. She has led numerous funded research projects and is ranked in the Top 1% of nursing researchers globally. She has been the recipient of several research awards.

A dedicated mentor and educator, Kim's work continues to shape the next generation of researchers, and to influence mental health policy, practice, and education.





Life Member 2025:

Mr James Houghton



James Houghton first registered in New Zealand as a Psychopaedic Nurse in 1983, as a Psychiatric Nurse in 1986 and as a Comprehensive Nurse (BSc Nursing) in 2001. He went on to complete a Postgraduate Diploma in Child and Family Nursing (Mental Health) in 2002. At this time James was a member of the Australia and New Zealand College of Mental Health Nurses until New Zealand separated in 2002.

James moved to Melbourne in 2005, initially working for Orygen Youth Health on the Inpatient Unit in Footscray. He moved to Dandenong in 2007 and worked as Senior Nurse in the Early Intervention Team (RAPPS) and as a Clinical Nurse Educator. In 2011 he rejoined NorthWestern Mental Health as CNE on John Cade IPU.

James had two secondments to Melbourne University at the Centre for Psychiatric Nursing (now Centre for Mental Health Nursing, CMHN) and then became a Clinical Nurse Consultant with the Mental Health Training and Development Unit (MHTDU) from 2016 to 2024.

James was also Project Lead for the Victorian Clinical Supervision for Mental Health Nurses Framework delivered from the Office of the Chief Psychiatric Nurse in 2018.

James has been a passionate supporter and member of the Australian College of Mental Health Nurses and held various positions on the Victorian Branch Committee including Professional Development Officer and Branch Chairperson including representing the Branch on CMHN's Collaborative Conference Committee and as a Board member of the Nursing and Midwifery Health Programme, Victoria.


31st Annual Oration






