Dominique Dalla-Pozza is a Senior Lecturer who researches and teaches at the Law School at the College of Law, Governance and Policy at the Australian National University. She also teaches with the ANU's National Security College. She brings an Australian public law perspective to her primary research interest: Australia's domestic national security law framework. Her research focuses on the workings of the Australian Parliament's legislative processes, how national security law is enacted and Australian national security accountability mechanisms. Dom undertook her PhD at the Gilbert + Tobin Centre of Public Law at UNSW where she focused on the process by which the Australian Parliament enacted counter-terrorism laws between 2001 and 2006. One of her main aims as a researcher is to continue to bring together ideas from the disciplines of political science and law to provide a richer understanding of the law-making process.
