

Prof Dr-Ing Michael Döllinger



Michael Döllinger studied mathematics at Friedrich-Alexander-University Erlangen-Nürnberg (FAU), Germany. He received the Diploma (M.Sc. in Mathematics) in February 2000, and the Ph.D. from FAU, in November 2002. From 2003 to 2005, he was a Postdoctoral Fellow with the University of California Los Angeles (UCLA). Then, he returned to Erlangen, Germany, and he received his Habilitation in Medical Pattern Recognition, a subarea of Artificial Intelligence, at FAU in 2006. In 2008 he became Professor for Computational Medicine and the Head of Research within the Division. He was Scientific Head of the DFG funded Research Group FOR894 “Fundamentals on Flow Dynamics in Voice Production”, from 2008 to 2013. Since 2008, he has been an Adjunct Professor with Louisiana State University, Baton Rouge (USA). He is co-chair of the Division of Phoniatics and Pediatric Audiology. He is also member of the Department for Informatics and the Department for Artificial Intelligence and Biomedical engineering at FAU. His research topics focus on voice and speech production combining machine learning, numerical and experimental approaches but also hard- and software development.
