When used responsibly, LLMs can drastically boost productivity. But what truly sets Generative AI apart is how it can identify overlooked gaps in both teaching and research. During this session, you'll get hands-on practice using Generative AI in teaching and research. We'll explore how it can turn complex academic papers into fun learning tools, how interactive games can help students learn through role-playing scenarios, foster design thinking exercises, generate quick case studies for in-class discussions and how AI can even support work-integrated learning.
