First ran in Newcastle, New South Wales in 2008 it was later adopted by and became a regular feature of the TAPNA Inc. (www.tapna.org.au) annual scientific meeting workshop programme. Following a post pandemic hiatus, toxic issues returned with an evolving, revised and modernised format in May 2025 after the TAPNA Inc. ASM in Wellington, New Zealand. Aimed at frontline ED/critical care/acute care clinicians in Australia/New Zealand, the course will be presented by a faculty of Toxicology experts, all currently in active practice within Toxicology services and poisons information centres across Australasia.
