SESSION D: Teaching Behaviors that Empower Students

This session will introduce empowering teaching behaviors that facilitate student engagement and learning. SESSION E: Integrating Informatics Principles for Clinical Nurse Educators

Data and technology in healthcare are evolving at an unprecedented speed and nurses interact with both in their daily work. Informatics is more than data entry into an electronic health record. It is how we translate the data into knowledge and wisdom. Informaticists examine a variety of technologies to determine benefit to patient outcomes and ideally to reduce the cognitive burden on clinicians. There is rarely an instance of clinical education that does not require a data component, and Clinical nurse educators are faced with the challenge of providing instruction to a diverse population of nurses in the same session who may be tech experts or tech naïve. Understanding how the basics principles of informatics relate into education, will set both the educator and learner up for success.
