Registration fees

All participants must pay the registration fee prior to arrival at the 2026 CSNM Conference venue. Participants are also advised to have a copy of their confirmation email or payment slip when going to the registration desk at the CSNM Conference just in case they are requested to show confirmation of their payment on arrival.

Cancellation

Super Early Bird deposits are non-refundable but can be transferred to another individual. Cancellations received on or before May 22, 2026, are subject to a 10% cancellation/admin fee. No refunds will be provided on or after May 22, 2026. Please send any cancellation requests in writing to csnm@csnm.ca.

Liability
