



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AIDS FOUNDATION CHICAGO

- 1,543 individuals had a place to call home in 2023

- 20 participants from the South Side of Chicago

Chicago Housing & Health Partnership (CHHP)

- 33 participants discharged from hospitals

Health, Housing, and Independent Living (HHIL)


- 34 families focusing on women and young children

Re-entry Housing & Health Partnership (RHHP)

- 33 justice-involved participants

Keep Empowering Young Adults to Succeed (KEYS)

- 40 young adults 18-30

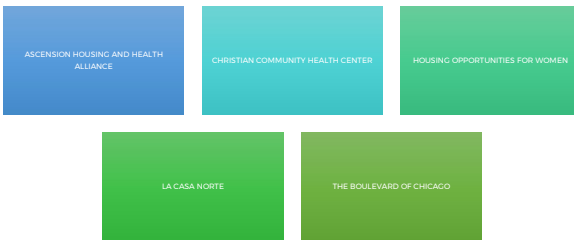

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BRAIDED FUNDING
