Ms Aleshia Duncan serves as the Deputy Assistant Secretary for International Nuclear Energy Policy and Cooperation in the Office of Nuclear Energy at the U.S. Department of Energy and oversees all international engagement and opportunities for the export of U.S. nuclear reactor technology.

Ms. Duncan has held two overseas posts. Most recently she spent three years in France at the Nuclear Energy Agency where she served as the Director General's Senior Advisor for Multilateral Coordination and the Secretary of the Steering Committee.

Ms Duncan was also posted at the U.S. Embassy in Tokyo, Japan as the Director for Nuclear Operations for three years. She managed the civil nuclear cooperation with the Government of Japan before, during and after its nuclear accident and was awarded the Secretary's Honor Award for her efforts in supporting the coordination of the United States crisis response to the accident at Fukushima Dai-ichi.

Ms Duncan holds a Bachelor of Arts in International Relations from Pennsylvania State University and a Master of Arts from Trinity University in Washington, DC.
