

Terms & Conditions Abstract submission IAEE 2026

14th International Conference on Ethics Education, Amsterdam, the Netherlands

1. Eligibility for Submission

- 1.1. Abstracts may be submitted by researchers, educators, practitioners, or students involved in ethics education or related fields
- 1.2. The submitting author ("Corresponding Author") must be at least 18 years old.

2. Originality and Authorship

- 2.1. Submitted abstracts must be **original work** that has not been previously published or presented at another major conference.
- 2.2. All listed authors must approve the abstract and its submission.
- 2.3. Plagiarism, including self-plagiarism, is strictly prohibited and will result in immediate rejection.

3. Ethical Compliance

- 3.1. Submissions involving human participants, educational interventions, or empirical research must comply with appropriate ethical standards and, where applicable, have received institutional ethics approval.
- 3.2. The authors are responsible for ensuring that no confidential or personally identifiable information is disclosed without consent.

4. Submission and Review Process

- 4.1. All abstracts must be submitted through the official conference submission system by the stated deadline.
- 4.2. Abstracts will undergo **peer review**, and acceptance is not guaranteed.
- 4.3. The Scientific Committee reserves the right to reassign presentations (oral, poster, workshop) based on program needs.

5. Presentation Requirements

- 5.1. At least one author must register for the conference and present the accepted abstract in person.
- 5.2. If the presenting author has not registered before June 10, 2026, the abstract will be removed from the final program and conference proceedings.

6. Permissions and Copyright

- 6.1. By submitting an abstract, the authors grant the conference organizers a **non-exclusive, royalty-free license** to reproduce, edit, and distribute the abstract in conference materials (e.g., website, program book, proceedings).
- 6.2. Authors retain copyright of their work.

7. Accuracy of Information

- 7.1. The Corresponding Author is responsible for ensuring the accuracy of all information submitted, including author names, affiliations, and contact details.
- 7.2. Changes after submission may not be possible.

8. Withdrawal Policy

- 8.1. Abstracts may be withdrawn by written request to the conference organizers (IAEE2026@amsterdamumc.nl) before the withdrawal deadline June 10, 2026.
- 8.2. After acceptance, withdrawals are discouraged except in cases of significant error or unforeseen circumstances.

9. Data Protection

- 9.1. Personal data submitted with abstracts will be used solely for review, communication, and planning purposes in accordance with applicable data protection regulations.
- 9.2. Contact information will not be shared with third parties without consent.

10. Liability Disclaimer

- 10.1. The conference organizers are not responsible for travel, accommodation, or visa arrangements of presenters.
- 10.2. Acceptance of an abstract does not imply financial support.
