Authors' Guidance

Guidelines for the preparation and submission of papers for CEDA DREDGING DAYS 2026

Issued by: CEDA – Central Dredging Association

for the Technical Papers Committee of CEDA Dredging Days 2026

1 INTRODUCTION

CEDA Dredging Days papers should describe original work and should not have been published or offered for publication elsewhere. It is the authors' responsibility to obtain all necessary approvals for publication from employers or others involved, before the submission of the paper.

2 CONTENT

Papers must be written in English in a clear and straightforward manner so as to be easily read and understood. It should be remembered that they will be read by many whose first language is not English. Simple sentence construction will assist clarity.

The maximum time allotted for presentations is 20 minutes (18 minutes presentation/2 minutes Q&A).

2.1 Abstract

The abstract should give a concise and informative description of the paper (maximum of 300 words) written to interest the reader as well as for information retrieval. Please note that the abstract in your manuscript should be identical to the abstract in the Presentation Portal.

2.2 Text

The paper must address the interests of readers with diverse specialities and backgrounds. Abbreviations and synonyms should be spelled out and identified the first time they are used. Trade names and professional jargon should be kept to a minimum. **The paper should be free from explicit and implicit commercialism or private interest.** Company and product names, if used, should be included for identification purposes only. References to earlier work in the field and credits to recent contributors should be included.

2.3 Terminology

The TPC requests the authors to avoid the use of the words listed below since due to their negative connotations those words propagate a negative image of dredging. Examples of preferred alternative words are also given.

- Sanitation → remediation/cleanup
- Sanitised → remediated/cleaned up
- Dumping → relocation, placement, disposal
- Spoil → sediment, silt, dredged material
- Sludge → sediment, silt, dredged material
- Noise → sound
- Polluted → contaminated

2.4 Symbols

All symbols must be shown in the nomenclature list that follows the text. The SI system of units should be used. If units other than SI units are included, they should be given in parenthesis after the relevant SI unit. The common units of time will persist, and also in appropriate contexts, the angular measurements.

2.5 Graphics and tables

Avoid commercial endorsements in illustrations. A graphic which includes a trade name incidentally is acceptable, but illustrations incorporating the logo of the company with which the author is associated will not be included in the proceedings.

2.6 References

Please use Harvard referencing style. Citations in the text should be given in parentheses, for example: (Author, Year) or (Author et al., Year) or (Author1 and Author2, Year). List your bibliographical references at the end of your paper in alphabetical order. For some typical reference list examples please see below.

Journal article – printed, with two authors:

Jones A. and Other A.N. (1987). Title of the very interesting and informative article. *Name of the international highly respected professional journal*, Vol. 2, No. 3, 1-20.

Journal article – online, with two authors:

Book:

Jones A., Other A.N. and Black J.K. (2000). *Title of the very interesting and informative book.* Publication information, 1-30.

Congress article:

Jones A., Other A.N. and Black J.K. (1999). *Title of the very interesting and informative congress paper, in proceedings of the very interesting and highly successful congress*, City, Country, 315-350.

To ensure a degree of uniformity authors are requested to use the template provided. Please find below the corresponding typing instructions.

4 SUBMISSION

Both draft manuscripts for review by the TPC and final papers must be uploaded in the Presentation Portal. The maximum size of the document is 5 MB. You have received a link via email to access the Presentation Portal.

4.1 Draft manuscripts for review by the TPC

Draft manuscripts must be submitted by **13 January 2026**. All draft manuscript will be peer reviewed. Comments from the reviewers will be available to the authors by **17 February 2026 the latest**.

4.2 40 word summary

Authors are requested to also upload a 40 word long summary, containing the innovative aspects of your paper (in other words, tell why people should read your paper/listen to your talk), as well as a high res, copyright free image related to your paper as a separate graphic file by **13 January 2026** the latest. We will use it in social media posts and other promotional activities relating to the conference.

4.3 Final papers

The final papers will be published in the Conference Proceedings. The final papers must be submitted by 10 March 2026. Please note that the TPC reserve the right to remove a paper from the programme and from publication if it finds that the reviewers' recommendations have not been followed, or discovers that the paper has been previously published.

Each final paper submission must include:

- The full final paper
- Registration as speaker
- The completed CEDA Dredging Days 2026 Copyright Form (to be uploaded via the speaker registration form)

Please note: The submission deadlines will be strictly enforced.

Important: It is understood by the submission of the final paper that one or more of the authors will register for the conference, pay the appropriate fee(s), attend the conference and present the paper in English. The presenting author (one author per paper) is entitled to a discount on the registration fee and will receive a link to the speaker registration form once the draft paper has been accepted.

4.4 Summary of important dates

Submission of summary and image: 13 January 2026
Reviewer comments to authors: 17 February 2026
Submission of final paper: 10 March 2026
Registration as speaker: 10 March 2026
