Charles C. Roehr is an academic neonatologist working in the UK, after completing his training in the UK, Germany and Australia. His own clinical and research interests centre around understanding the cardio-respiratory adaptation during fetal-to-neonatal transition and on how to best support the newly born infant. Charles has a strong interest in studies that help answer clinically relevant questions to improve the lives of babies and their families.

He is the chair for Neonatal and Perinatal Medicine at the University of Bristol, Honorary Consultant Neonatologist at Southmead Hospital, North Bristol NHS Trust, and Clinical Consultant Advisor to the National Perinatal Epidemiology Unit - Clinical Trials Unit, Nuffield Department of Population Health at the University of Oxford. Charles plans and conducts large scale clinical trials at the cross-section of perinatology and neonatology.

As a strong proponent of evidence-based neonatology and care for the newborn infant. Charles is a member of the International Liaison Committee on Resuscitation (ILCOR) neonatal task force and guideline writing group and sits on several editorial boards of well-known international paediatric journals. Charles has served as president and chairs for various prestigious European research structures - Paediatric research network, the European Society for Paediatric Research (ESPR, 2016-2023), NLS Scientific Co-Chair, a scientific advisor to the European Foundation for the Care of Newborn Infants (EFCNI).
