Safia Mahomed is a Professor at UNISA's School of Law. She is an admitted attorney in the North Gauteng High Court. After practicing as an attorney for a short period, Safia pursued her academic journey in 2012. She obtained her LLM (Masters in Law) from UNISA in 2013 and her PhD from the University of the Witwatersrand (WITS) in 2018. Her research interests focus on questions around health law and bioethics, with specific emphasis on identifying gaps in South Africa's health research framework and developing regulatory measures to address them. Her current research trajectory involves an examination of the ethical and legal considerations for human tissue transfer, protection of personal information and artificial intelligence in healthcare. Safia was awarded UNISA's Principal's Prize for excellence in research in 2019. She is a current member and former Chair of UNISA's Biotechnology and Medical Law Flagship and a former fellow of the National Department of Higher Education's Future Professor's Programme (Cohort 1). Safia is an editor at the South African Journal on Human Rights and a member of the Biobanks Ethics Committee at WITS University. She has published extensively in national and international peer reviewed journals and contributed to book chapters.
