Professor Mogamat-Yazied Chothia is an associate professor, and Head of the Division of Nephrology at Tygerberg Hospital and Stellenbosch University. He holds an MBChB, FCP(SA), MMed, Certificate in Nephrology, and a PhD from Stellenbosch University.

His clinical and academic career spans over two decades, with expertise in electrolyte and acid-base disorders with an emphasis on hyperkalaemia, chronic kidney disease, and hypertension. He has 62 peer-reviewed publications, including contributions to high-impact journals such as *The Lancet Global Health*, *Kidney International Reports*, and *Clinical Kidney Journal*. He has also authored a book chapter in Brenner and Rector's *The Kidney*. His work has been cited widely, with more than 1,000 citations (Google Scholar h-index: 11).

Prof. Chothia has received awards for excellence in teaching and leadership, supervised many postgraduate students (many with related publications), and serves as a certified mentor for the International Society of Nephrology (ISN). He has also acted as an ISN Educational Ambassador to the Maldives teaching on electrolyte and acid-base disorders. He is associate editor of the *African Journal of Nephrology* and academic editor for *PLOS ONE*.

He is an active member of multiple professional societies (SANS, AFRAN, ISN, ASN, SAHS), serves on national and international committees, and is Deputy Chair of the AFRAN Renal Registry Committee. He has contributed to provincial and national guideline development, including the South African Essential Medicines List and renal palliative care consensus statements. Internationally recognized, Prof. Chothia has been an invited speaker at numerous national and international conferences, with plenary and state-of-the-art lectures. He is also deeply committed to outreach and community engagement, including coordinating dialysis access support with Gift of the Givers and health promotion through the Itheke Sports Athletics Club. Beyond medicine, he is a passionate runner.
