Andrew Ewer is Emeritus Professor of Neonatal Medicine at the University of Birmingham, an Associate Editor for Archives of Disease in Childhood Fetal and Neonatal Edition and President of the Neonatal Society.

He qualified from Birmingham UK and trained in Paediatrics and Neonatology in Birmingham (UK), Sheffield (UK) and Melbourne (Australia). He was awarded MD in 1998.

He has a wide-ranging research portfolio with a particular interest in newborn screening. He Led the NIHR HTA funded PulseOx study and has published widely on pulse oximetry screening including 3 systematic reviews (2007 [ADCFN] 2012 [Lancet] and 2018 [Cochrane library])

He advised the USA SACHDNC committee on prior to the introduction screening for Critical Congenital Heart Defects in Jan 2011 and has worked with NIPE/NSC UK since 2011 and was clinical lead for the UK Pulse oximetry screening pilot study in 2015.

He is a senior member of a European Workgroup on pulse oximetry screening and published a European consensus statement in 2017. Until his recent retirement he was Director of Research and Development at BWH and continues as a co-applicant on 4 national clinical trials and is a member of various NIHR Trail Steering and Data Monitoring Committees.
