Firstly, if you haven't already done so, don't forget to register for the conference! If your colleague is presenting on your behalf, please ensure they also register to attend the conference. You can register here:

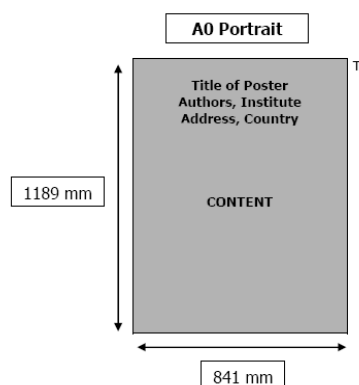

IMPORTANT UPDATE FOR 2026: Posters will be printed by the event team, please submit your poster as a PDF to UKIBCS@kc-jones.co.uk by **Monday 5th January 2026**.

Previously, posters were located in the centre of the exhibition hall. However, under the ABPI Code, access to the exhibition is restricted to Healthcare Professionals (HCPs) and Other Relevant Decision Makers (ORDMs). For 2026, the poster boards will form the perimeter of the exhibition area, with each poster **displayed on both sides**. This layout ensures that individuals who are not permitted to enter the exhibition area can still view the posters.

Your poster will be installed ahead of your arrival to the ICC Birmingham. A full list of posters, including board numbers, will be available closer to the event to help you locate yours. You are welcome to take your posters with you at the end of the Symposium. Any posters left will be recycled.

In addition to the printed posters, they will also be made available in a digital format via the Conference App.



Designing your Poster

Posters should be designed **A0 PORTRAIT** sized poster (84.1 cm (841 mm) x 118.9 cm (1189mm)).

Please ensure that you include the title of your poster presentation at the top of your poster.

Lay Summary: As patient representatives will participate in the judging, **all posters should include a panel containing a lay summary of the study**. This should describe the purpose of the study, mention the methodology used, highlight the main findings and the conclusion in a language understandable for a lay audience.

If your poster is not received by Monday 5th January 2026, the event team will be unable to print it. Should you miss this deadline, you will need to print **two copies** of your poster and bring them with you to the event. Please note that UKIBCS cannot cover printing costs for posters not submitted to the organisers by the deadline.

Presenting your poster

Posters will be available for viewing during all refreshment and lunch breaks. Poster presenters are encouraged to stand by their displays during these times to answer any questions. If you are an HCP or ORDM presenting a poster, please alternate the side of the poster wall you stand on during each break to ensure you have the opportunity to engage with all attendees.
