Travelling to the University/Parking

Park and Ride:

- ✓ One ticket must be purchased for each passenger (£2.20 per person)
- ✓ Must use the bus provided. Park and stride is not permitted.

Buses run every 15 minutes, Monday to Saturday.

- Belmont Park and Ride leaves at 00, 15, 30 and 45 minutes past the hour.
 The first bus is at 7.00 am and the last bus is at 6.30 pm.
- Sniperley Park and Ride leaves at 10, 25, 40 and 55 minutes past the hour.
 The first bus is at 7.10 am and the last bus is at 6.35 pm.



Free Shuttle Buses

Shuttle buses will operate every 10-15 minutes starting at 08:30 and finishing at 16:30. Last bus will leave Palatine Centre at 16:30pm to go to Train Station.











Open day map

College Allocation Process

At Durham, every student is a member of a college, and every college provides a sense of community and belonging, which stays with you throughout your time as a student here, and long after you leave. Each college is a vibrant community of students from different backgrounds, nationalities, subject areas and levels of study.

We have 16 colleges for undergraduate students. Once you receive an academic offer from Durham you will shortly afterwards be given the opportunity to list your college preferences. Currently the intention is that you will be able to list your top three preferences, and you will also be able to indicate whether you would prefer a catered or a self-catered college; we will confirm this nearer the time. We will do our best to try and allocate you a place in one of your preferred colleges, although this cannot be guaranteed since every college has limited spaces. If you do not state a preference, then we will allocate you a college at random.

You will have two weeks to complete your preferences and will hear about your college preliminary allocation soon afterwards, to enable you to visit your college at one of our Post-offer Visit Days which are usually held around February, March and April. Please remember that this allocation is preliminary until exam results are known and your place at Durham is confirmed. Once your place at Durham is confirmed, your college allocation will be confirmed shortly after. We try and ensure that offer holders who successfully achieve a place at Durham remain with their preliminary allocated college wherever possible'.

Event Bursary Claims

Help with travel and accommodation costs

An Event Bursary is available to assist with the cost of travel and accommodation for an applicant to attend an Undergraduate Recruitment Event. A maximum of £200 per applicant can be claimed per event.

Event Bursary - Are You Eligible?

In order to claim you will need to provide the following evidence prior to the event:

Evidence that shows you are in receipt of government-funded and income-assessed financial support from your college or sixth form, such as a 16-19 bursary or free school meals.

AND

Evidence that shows you are a student at a state-maintained school/college.

or

Evidence that shows you are care-experienced and/or estranged (CEES).

or

Evidence that shows you are studying at an independent school and in receipt of a full scholarship awarded on the grounds of financial hardship.

or

Are part of, or have successfully completed one of the following Access and Participation schemes with Durham University:

STEP, Sutton Trust Summer School, Supported Progression.

Left Luggage

We no longer accept left luggage

Martyn's Law aims to improve protective security and organisational preparedness across the UK by mandating, for the first time, those responsible for certain premises and events to consider the terrorist risk and how they would respond to an attack.

What you need to know about Martyn's Law:

The Bill requires certain venues to fulfil necessary but proportionate steps according to their capacity to mitigate the impact of a terrorist attack and reduce harm. The duties that premises will have will depend on the size of the venue. The University falls into the premises and events with a capacity of 800 or above which is the enhanced tier

A risk assessment has been undertaken and a proportionate step is to no longer accept left luggage. Attendees staying overnight will be asked to leave them at their overnight accommodation or make alternative arrangements.



Quiet Room

We have a designated quiet room for use during the Open Days which people can use as a space set aside from the noise and crowds of the event.

The room is PCL051 in the Palatine Centre.

A handful of students have indicated that they would find this room helpful during the Open Days and so please be aware to know where you can direct someone requesting this on the day.





Faith Facilities

We have access to a number of faith facilities for on the day.

Many of these facilities are available to use, including multi-faith rooms at St Aidan's College and Trevelyan College (ask college reception staff for details), and Islamic Prayer rooms immediately North of Grey College or on Old Elvet.
