Abstract

A well-functioning town or city can be characterized by having good relations among local actors, thus local government, companies, firms, institutions, civil and nonprofit organizations, universities cooperate with each other with the goal of facing successfully the new challenges arise in the 21st century. Places face the challenge of global and local trends and they have to find the answers by collaborating of local actors. Each actor has a significant role; the big challenge is to find the way how these actors can contribute to a sustainable and developed future. These challenges can have different faces in different territorial units, the most exciting issue is to know the way how the different actors can apply their solutions.
