SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

Dr Jatinder Minhas

Dr Minhas is Clinical Associate Professor of Stroke Medicine and Honorary Consultant Stroke Physician at the University of Leicester. He leads and collaborates on a number of clinical and physiologically focused stroke studies and has a particular interest in intracerebral haemorrhage.

Dr Neshika Samarasekera

Dr Samarasekera is a Consultant Neurologist and Stroke Physician at NHS Lothian and NRS Research Fellow and Stroke Association Senior Clinical Lecturer. Dr Samarasekera's research interest is in the epidemiology, causes and the effects of intracerebral haemorrhage on patients and on the brain.

Professor Andrew Farrell

Prof. Farrall is a Consultant Neuroradiologist and Honorary Professor of Neuroimaging and Education, University of Edinburgh. Prof Farrall's main research interest is in how imaging can be applied to the investigation of stroke, small vessel disease & the ageing process. Prof Farrall is Programme Director of the Edinburgh Imaging Academy, which delivers imaging related degree programmes at the University of Edinburgh

Dr Anna Podlasek

Dr Podlasek is a GP with Special Interest in Stroke from Nottingham. Dr Podlasek works with Prof Iris Grunwald's group at the University of Dundee.

Dr Matt Lambert

Dr Lambert is a Consultant Stroke Physician and Geriatrician, working in NHS Tayside and is Scotland's National Clinical Lead for Stroke and the Stroke Specialty Advisor to the Chief Medical Officer

Dr Claire Howard

Dr Howard is a clinical academic orthoptist, a neuro/stroke specialist orthoptist in the Manchester Centre for Clinical Neurosciences based at Salford Royal hospital, part of Northern Care Alliance NHS Foundation Trust; an honorary senior lecturer in research (University of Salford), honorary research fellow (University of Liverpool) and a clinical research fellow in the NCA Centre for Clinical and Care Research. She is a DVLA medical advisory panel member for vision disorders and the Greater Manchester hub lead for the Council for Allied Health Professions Research (CAHPR).

Dr Howard's research interests include post stroke visual impairment, driving, adaptation to visual impairment, hemianopia, blindsight and brain injury. Her research methodologies include mixed methods, observational studies, consensus methods, clinical validation studies and randomised control trials.

Dr Ingrid Hoeritzauer

Dr Hoeritzauer is a consultant neurologist with an interest functional neurological disorders, holds an NRS Fellowship and is a principal investigator of the Functional Neurological Disorders Research Group at the University of Edinburgh

Dr Alyson Nelson

Dr Nelson is a Consultant in Rehabilitation Medicine at the Astley Ainslie Hospital in Edinburgh. Dr Nelson runs a specialist multidisciplinary spasticity management clinic treating patients with spasticity due to a range of neurological conditions

Prof Jesse Dawson

Professor Dawson is Professor of Stroke Medicine at the University of Glasgow and Consultant Physician in the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital. Prof Dawson's research portfolio includes clinical trials in prevention and rehabilitation in stroke survivors

Prof Chris Price

Chris Price is Professor in Stroke and Applied Health Research at Newcastle University, NIHR National Stroke Lead and Deputy Director of the NIHR Applied Research Collaboration (ARC) for North East North Cumbria. He is chief investigator of academic and industry collaborators to evaluate and implement interventions seeking to improve delivery of emergency stroke treatments

Prof Marian Brady

Prof Brady is the research group lead for living with stroke in the Nursing, Midwifery and Allied Health Professions Research Unit at Glasgow Caledonia University. Prof Brady's research interests include therapeutic interventions (for example speech and language therapy for people with aphasia), basic care issues (for example incontinence, oral health care), and interventions that address the needs of stroke survivors as they adapt to life after stroke (for example returning to work, psychosocial issues).

Prof Terry Quinn

Professor Quinn holds the post of David Cargill Chair of Geriatric Medicine and Honorary Consultant Physician in Stroke and Geriatric Medicine at the University of Glasgow. Prof Quinn has a broad research portfolio, his principal research interests are around trial methodology, functional assessment and neuropsychological consequences of cardiovascular disease. Prof Quinn held the inaugural Chief Scientist Office/Stroke Association Priority Program Grant for his research into cognitive outcomes following stroke

Prof Christine Roffe

Professor Roffe is Professor of Stroke Medicine at Keele University. Prof Roffe leads the UK NIHR Hyperacute Stroke Research Centre Oversight Group. Prof Roffe's research interests are acute and hyperacute interventions for stroke and prevention of stroke complications such as hypoxia and pneumonia
