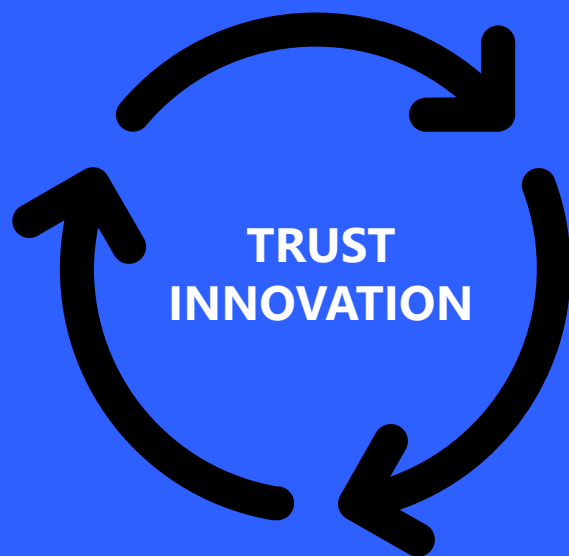

- Since 2011 an established organisation for cooperation – purpose
 - Long tradition of health data and positive attitude population – trust
 - 15 years of cooperation gives insights (VPOD & ePSOS)
 - EU Directive on Cross Border Care (2011) – voluntary – **legal basis** for sharing data **varies** between the countries

- EHDS – Regulation : mandatory also in all Nordic countries – **legal basis** for sharing data **in common**
 - Implementing Acts – huge impact on the realization of the EHDS
 - Three EHDS mandatory national institutions: DHA, HDAB and MSA
 - Primary and secondary use of data should be handled together



What the EHDS means for Sweden

- EHDS = adapt not develop (legislation)
- National digital infrastructure needed beyond that is explicitly regulated in the EHDS
- Healthcare is a national competency and in Sweden the responsibility of the regions – the EHDS regulates health data as an individual right
- From monolith to best of breed - processes, masterdata, synchronization
