





Exploring Next Steps

- Engaging in multi-year Indigenous-led fire prescriptions in the Saskatchewan River Delta (SRD).
- Continuing land-based learning in the SRD (We are Fire camps), includes language and cultural revitalization.
- Sharing our collaborative and applied research in the SRD with other jurisdictions.
- Advocating for Indigenous-led fire practices to be honoured in wildfire legislation and policy in Saskatchewan that reflect the Truth and Reconciliation of Commission of Canada's *Calls to Action* and *United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples*.
- Continuing to be allies of change in fire reconciliation and habitat restoration in the SRL
- Photodocumenting Indigenous fire practices and shared learnings in the SRD.






