Forest and Economy-Some facts and figures

- There can be no healthy economy on an unhealthy planet.
- On the other hand, if there is no economic value, there is no ecology and conservation.
- World gross domestic product-GDP (usd 84.4 trillion in 2020) depends moderately (usd 31 trillion per year) or highly (usd 13 trillion per year) on ecosystem services, including those provided by forests. https://www.fao.org/3/cb9360en/cb9360en.pdf
- One-third of the global population (about 2.6 billion people) relies on wood and other traditional fuels for household cooking
- In general, 80 % of the extreme poor live in rural areas

Public policies that create incentives to develop economic activities in rural land

• Chile:

- Thanks to a long-term reforestation policy, Chile's forest industry represents 2.1% of national GDP. USD 6.8 billion export, representing 9.1% of Chilean total export.
- Annual harvesting of 48 million m3 from a total of 3.1 million hectares of plantation forest. Average annual increment of 30-40 m3 per hectare. (World Bank).

• Saudi Arabia:

• In the year of 2022, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia pledge to restore land and plant 50 billion trees and increase its vegetation cover by 12 times. (UNCCD)

• Türkiye:

- Thanks to the "Honey Forests", which started to be established by the General Directorate of Forestry since 2011, young people and women also turned to beekeeping besides men. (AA)
- An average of 10 thousand hectares of Forest land is damaged by forest fires per year. However, in 1946, a total of 165 thousand hectares of forest burned in one year. This is because all forests were nationalized by a law approved by the Parliament in 1945.

Making rural land more managed and less prone to the landscape fires.

- In January 2022, the Forest Service of the USA launched a robust, 10-year strategy called "Confronting the Wildfire Crisis: A Strategy for Protecting Communities and Improving Resilience in America's Forests," that will dramatically increase the scale and pace of forest health treatments over the next decade. https://www.fs.usda.gov/managing-land/wildfire-crisis
- Wood-based products, which we use in many fields such as construction, furniture and paper, guarantee the health of Forests.
- Forests and trees become more resistant to fire and other threats when wood based are produced in accordance with forestry techniques and silvicultural methodologies.










- An area larger than the EU was lost to deforestation between 1990 and 2020, with EU consumption causing around 10% of losses
- Cattle, cocoa, coffee, palm-oil, soya, wood, rubber, charcoal and printed paper products are covered by the new rules
- · Human rights and the rights of indigenous people added as additional requirements





Financing Nature Based Solutions

- The United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) calculates that finance for nature-based solutions currently amounts to USD133 billion per year (UNEP, 2021); public funds make up 86% of this and private finance accounts for only 14%.
- State of Finance for Nature report indicated that annual investments in nature-based solutions will have to triple by 2030 and increase four-fold by 2050 (using 2020 as the base year).



State and Trends of Carbon Pricing

- In 2021, higher carbon prices resulted in a record USD 84 billion of global carbon pricing revenue, around 60% higher than in 2020.
- Nature-based credits are in especially high demand.
- Forestry and land use transactions more than doubled between 2020 and 2021.
- Increasing demand for carbon removals has resulted in price increases for these credits. (The World Bank-State and Trends of Carbon Pricing 2022)

Landscape Fire Governance Framework


- With over 300 million hectares burned annually, Landscape Fires are causing more severe impacts on populations and ecosystems.
- To better prepare societies the 8th International Wildland Fire Conference in Porto, proposes a fire governance model called Landscape Fire Governance Framework.


