


Key changes occurring

- More extreme fires
- Fire seasons longer, fire regime shifting north
- 2022: fires across Europe southeast, west, north
- Fires breaking out in the 'wrong' countries
- High population density, low awareness, preparedness
- Communication often one-way and narrow perspectives

Fire can learn from water, but also regarding communication?

- Government framing of floods: we've got you covered, you're safe with us
- Very little focus on what to do in case of floods: insurance, evacuation
- Dutch people look at government to reduce risks, more than in European South
- Flood risk reduction mostly government action
 - Dikes, mounds landscape engineering
- Fire risk reduction requires individual change too
 - Ignitions, fuel management

For good communication, knowledge of drivers is essential

- Awareness: 'we do not have fires' fire is something in warm countries, in summer
- Fire cause: unknown, fire cause investigation very sparse
- Fire danger: poorly understood, FWI does not work forecasting challenging
- Fire behavior: urban fire service lacking good understanding of fire behavior, management
- Fire impact: home ignition zone not managed
- Governance: no policy
- Extreme fires: drivers, processes, forecasting

Effect: decisions taken during events instead of in advance, based on assumptions, causing tensions



Tensions

- Government residents: Deurnese Peel crisis communication, evacuation notice by printed letter, no contact point. Fear, anger, distrust
- Fire service land management: communicate high fire danger or not? Fear for fire setters. Interestingly forest service used to do significant propaganda but now afraid to do so.
- Fire service biodiversity: request to mow roadsides during very high fire danger.

What is needed for change?

- Tried 15 years via the media, from
 - We have fires
 - We are not prepared
- To: do we need a disaster before action is taken?
 - Internally
 - To stakeholders
 - To the media but left out and framed 'fires getting out of hand in Mediterranean, but we got it all under control'
 - To: prominent teaser after Dutch evening news (scary)
- Helped push for urgency, indirectly via fire service
- Successful lobby now high on the political agenda

- Dutch National Crisis Plan: Scenario development, how, what, when to communicate during high fire danger, simultaneous fires, exceedance of fire suppression capacity
- Noord Brabant risk communication: how to communicate wildfire risk?
- Risk awareness: serious game with residents, policy makers

- Identify the community's needs, interests, knowledge as starting point.



Simplified, risk-focused messages Acknowledge wildfires as multifaceted, complex processes

- Dare to dive into complexity, uncertainty and ambiguity around wildfires
- Acknowledge wildfires are the 'top of the iceberg' = many underlying issues to address -> identify together with communities
- Get creative! (co)create stories, poems, drawings, videos, photos, objects, etc FOGO FRIO

- Incl. risk communication, writing policy/management briefs









Match students, stakeholders



Take home message

- Fire is changing, requires individual action, more than in floods
- Need to understand fire for good communication emerging fire regions
- Netherlands: communication challenges, putting fire on political agenda
- Wildfire Communication: Citizens and experts collaborating side by side, through multidirectional communication and acknowledging wildfires as multifaceted, complex processes.
 - The benefits of this holistic, human-centered approach goes way beyond merely wildfires
- Implications for training/education
