




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



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Background

What is unregistered emigration?

Key questions:

- 1. How many people are registered as residents in Norway, but have emigrated?
- 2. What characterises this group?
- 3. What are the best methods to identify the unregistered emigrants?
- Are there any data sources that could supplement this work? 4.

The project is based on a previous unfinished project from 2015





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Administrative Emigration by the Norwegian Tax Authority

Tax Authority's control measures:

- 1. Yearly control of Eea-citizens
- 2. Yearly control of people with "unknown addresses"
- 3. Monthly control of people with expired residence permits

These control measures are dependent on legislation and subject to change






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
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Emigration Numbers for Norway





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
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
Data

- People registered as residents of Norway on January 1st
- Income data Labour income, capital income, money transfers
- National Population Register (NPR) Births, changes in marital status, changes of address
- System for Personal Data (SFP) Labour market activity, education, welfare payments





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Method

Let P_t be the set of the population where we search for inactivity. In our case, P_t is the set of all the people registered as residents in Norway aged 15 or older, at the beginning of the year t:


$$P_t = \{p_1, p_2, \dots, p_n\},\$$

where n is the size of the population.





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Method

Define the indicator function, $I(p_i, R_{t-1,j})$, for any element p_i with respect to a data source $R_{t-1,j}$, as follows:

$$I(p_i, R_{t-1,j}) = \begin{cases} 1, & \text{if } p_i \notin R_{t-1,j} \\ 0, & \text{if } p_i \in R_{t-1,j} \end{cases}$$

Then, we can find the individuals p_i who are not in any of the administrative registers by taking the sum of the products of the indicator functions for each data source:

$$\sum_{i=1}^{n}\prod_{j}^{k}I(p_{i},R_{t-1,j})$$





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
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
Model Estimations

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Results


	2021	2022	2023
Model 1: Zero Income Approach	90,028	98,108	99,199
Model 2: Household Corrected Income Approach	32,182	38,224	44,068
Model 3: Register approach	20,929	23,570	20,175



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Immigrants make up the largest share of the estimated unregistered emigrants

Born in Norway to Norwegian-born parents
Immigrants
Norwegian-born to immigrant parants
Foreign-born with one immigrant parent
Norwegian-born with one foreign-born parent
Foreign-born to Norwegian-born parents






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Reason for immigration








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Age and gender distribution



- Mostly working-age men
- Women in their mid-twenites
- Administrative survivors
 - 0.5 percent of the estimated unregistered emigrants are 100 years or older
 - This share is 0.02 percent for the total population


