


## The NACE classification index

- NACE is the 'Statistical Classifications of economic activities', it is a hierarchical classifications with four levels, the most detailed level has 651 positions
- NACE is one of the most used classifications in the European Statistical System in over 40 statistical products; e.g. European business statistics, national and satellite accounts
- The NACE index breaks down the content of each NACE class into granular entries (currently over 8500 draft entries):
  - >Improved transparency, standardisation of coding practices
  - More machine-processable content which can boost the performance of the search function of the online platform for visualising classifications and the performance of automatic coding approaches
  - Facilitates the revision work (formulation of explanatory notes and creation of correspondence tables)
- Scalable to other classifications of the integrated system of classifications

## Development of a dynamic online platform

- User-friendly interface will enable users to input specific search terms to find correct categories in the relevant classifications
- Shows correspondences and linkages between the classifications in the integrated system of statistical activity and product classifications:

- > user-friendly interface tailored terminologically for statisticians and non-technical users, straightforward text definitions, easy to use search and download capabilities, targeted inclusion or exclusion of descriptions, a simplified two-tab menu for data and downloads, a customisable landing page
- > conversion of NACE classification into linked data, facilitating the ongoing exchange and integration of data between various platforms and applications
- > encourages collaboration among stakeholders, fostering continuous innovation and the refinement of classification systems
