

The ESS peer review in 2014 had significant impact on the Norwegian Statistical System





RECOMMENDATIONS

- Clarify the role of the Board of **Statistics Norway**
- Strengthen Statistics Norway's national coordination role
- Better define the term "official statistics"
- Provide a mandate for the Statistics Council

RESULTS

2014

New Statistics Act adopted in 2019, establishing:

 - The National Programme for Official Statistics
 - The Committee for Official **Statistics**

- Monitoring the quality of the entire Norwegian Statistical System
- Consider the possibilities for publishing more detailed statistics
- Strengthening staff competence
- The ONAs should improve the transparency and visibility of their role as producers of official statistics

Coordination with the Eurostat Task Force on quality and peer reviews Proposals for improvement actions developed by the specific divisions in Statistics Norway and the ONAs targeted by the recommendations

Approval by the Director General in Statistics Norway and the relevant director for statistics in the ONAs

Criteria used by Statistics Norway for developing improvement actions

- They should be SMART
 - Specific, measurable, attainable, relevant and time-bound
- They should be useful
 - For further development of Statistics Norway, the ONAs and the National Statistical System
- They should be integrated with existing plans and strategies
 - Avoiding parallel reporting and procedures

Key success factors

- Early planning and preparation
- Inclusive approach
- Engaging with the expert team
- Engaging with stakeholders
- Decentralised development of improvement actions
