
### Independence of official statistics

- Official statistics = public service
- Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics
  - Principle 1: Relevance, Impartiality, and Equal Access
  - Principle 2: Professional Standards, Scientific Principles, and Professional Ethics
  - Principle 3: Accountability and Transparency
- European Statistics Code of Practice
  - Principle 1: Professional independence

#### De facto status?

- Valuable and trusted source for informed decision-making
- SDG indicator 17.18.2: national statistical legislation complies with the Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics
  - 37/61 comply, 9 do not comply
  - Missing data!
- Seven countries indicated in 2022 that contrasted to previous years,
  their legislations are no longer compliant with the Principles

### Dismissal of director-general in Slovenia

- May 2020
- Legal steps taken
- Current reading by the court:
  - Use Statistics Act for dismissal for professional reasons
  - Use Civil Servants Act for political discretion to dismiss directorgeneral
- ESS Peer Review 2023: compliance-relevant recommendation
