### Future of oncology pharmacy technician workforce Chairs: Chandra Maraj & Claire Kennedy

All over the country we are pushing boundaries and reassessing what Pharmacy Technicians can do now, this coupled with the endorsement of the NHS Long Term Workforce plan, recent consultations on changes to scope of practice from the Department of Health & Social Care means that we all need to be aware, supportive, and engaged with the changing pharmacy landscape.
