





Iceland State Police and Isavia in close collaboration

- First focus on Keflavík Airport
 - 95% of all entries to Iceland go through KEF
 - Able to handle majority of implementation at one border station
 - Border system without EES from same supplier
 - Able to switch-back if issues arise: allows gradual implementation
 - Border staff trained in the same environment.
 - New (moveable) immigration hall especially built for EES in Q2 2023.
 - 66 kiosks implemented Q2-23, have been continually updated and tested
 - Extremely close and continuous collaboration btw. Isavia and State Police

Challenges and concerns

- Main challenges
 - Technical Challenges
 - ACD Connection Point: Frequent bugs and multiple adjustments required
 - Central System Functionality: Not fully operational for real functionality testing
 - European Regulation pending issuance, could affect timeline
 - Limited acknowledgement by state and justice department on magnitude of operations and maintenance after implementation
 - Annual cost estimated a minimum of 1 billion ISK
 - Arrival/Departure sync:
 - Managing passengers who enter during transition period
 - Departures potentially pose more challenges than arrivals
 - Infrastructure upgrade:
 - 12 automated non-Schengen departure gates
 - Accommodate third-country nationals
 - Uncertainty over pressure on secondary inspection due to low-quality passports
