Conflicts of Interest: Definitions

a set of circumstances that creates **a risk** that professional judgment or actions regarding **a primary interest** (integrity in research) will be **unduly influenced** by a **secondary interest**

Institute of Medicine Report, 2009

a collision between **a duty** (office/position/ work-related duty) and **a tangible or intangible** interest, where the duty vs. interest collision tempts the person concerned to disregard their duty and constitutes **a threat** to the interest of someone else *Villarán A, 2020*

Results: Publishers' Influence on Journals' CoI Policies

Journals (N = 100)

Only publisher's policies54%Journal's* and publisher's policies14%

Only journals' policies* 32%

* including journal's internal policies

Results: Publishers' Influence on Journals' Policies

Strictly unifying publisher's policy *Taylor and Francis, Nature Portfolio, Annual Reviews*

Harmonizing effect of publisher's policy ("aligned with"): *Elsevier - One Earth*

Subsidiarity of publisher's policy: Wiley - Comprehensive Reviews in Food Science and Food Safety

Diversity (law, economics) Oxford Academic - Quarterly Journal of Economics, Journal of Environmental Law

Non-Compliance (request for anonymity)

Financial tresholds

subjective criterion

"any undeclared competing financial interests that could embarrass you were they to become publicly known after your work was published" *Nature Portfolio*

objective criterion

financial support summing to at least US\$10,000 in the past three years *Econometrica*

SDU & Results: Fit-for-purpose disclosure, management and enforcement strategies in Journals' Policies?

Authors Conflicts of interest

Disclosure. No management, no enforcement. *Energy policy*

Disclosure \rightarrow ?

"The disclosure MAY be published with the article." *Transnational Environmental Law*

Disclosure + preventive management

"We do not...publish pieces for which the author was paid taxable income by an organization other than the relevant employer" *Stanford Law Review*

Disclosure + enforcement of disclosure. No management.

revocation of acceptance: Yale Law Review, authors correction: Advances in Optics and Photonics journal erratum: Annual Reviews retraction: Taylor and Francis

Reviewers/Editors Conflicts of Interest

Disclosure \rightarrow **management**

another editor, reviewer assigned

No disclosure. Management of reviewer's conflicts of interests

IEEE Communications Surveys and Tutorials

Conclusion: Conflict of Interest in Journals' Policies

= to significant extent: conflict of interest in publishers' policies

fragmental, hard to navigate (even for journals themselves)

diverse (legal and economics journals)

reflecting on current debates:

having a "non-financial conflict of interest": having other interests/relationship, professional, personal, or business concerns, outside activities *Bero L. PLoS Biol 2016*
