## **Starting points**

- Until now RI has mainly focused on improving research as applied by universities and research centers.
- While principles of RI have been captured in many ways, it is not yet clear how their positive influence applies to the translation of research to innovation and policymaking.

## **Consultation document**



EXPAND



- a. Incentive structure, without compromising basic/blue sky research or academic independence in research agenda setting
- **b.** Coherency in quality systems, while acknowledging that basic research is different from translation
- c. Communication between RPOs and industry, very upstream on the translation pathways, without compromising academic in research agenda setting

- **d.** The target audience by involving policy advisors, lobbyists, think-tanks, and journalists, since they have a significant influence on the decisions of policymakers
- e. The focus of RI to activities across supply chains, e.g. working conditions where raw materials are extracted for translation to come into being
