	Identifying the need, role descriptions, mentoring / shadowing; passing the torch;
	identifying and preparing future leaders - mentoring strategies, leadership pipelines,
	knowledge transfer, embedding succession into your culture (including competency).
	Protecting your organisation and people - Oversight and governance:
	Reflecting on the activities you run on the water, the people that take part, the duty of
	care that exists and the liabilities you face - consider the assurance and oversight you
	need to protect your organisation and people.
