- No systematic pan-European review of climatic change academic programmes exists.

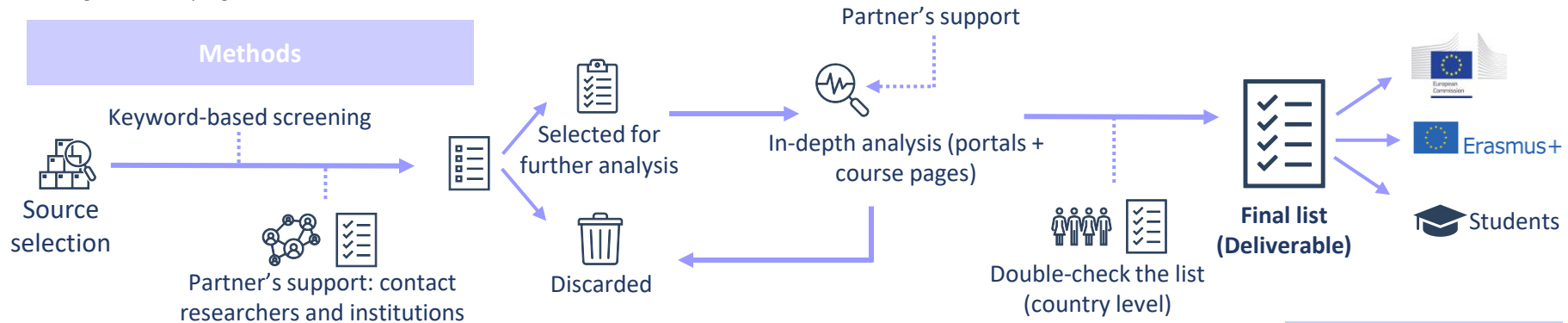
## Objective
