



Sayaka Tojima is an Assistant Professor at the Hakubi Center, Kyoto University, Japan. She received her B.A. (Literature) from Nara Women's University, Faculty of Letters, where she studied Zooarchaeology. She then received her PhD (Science) from the Graduate School of Science, Kyoto University in 2014. After a three-years fellowship at the Laboratory of Developmental Biology, Graduate School of Science, Kyoto University, she became an Assistant Professor at the Department of Anatomy and Cell Biology, Graduate School of Medicine, Osaka City University, in 2017. In October 2021, she moved to Kyoto University's Hakubi Center, which fosters promising young researchers. She is investigating the morphology and morphogenetic mechanism of the tail from multiple perspectives (Anatomy, Developmental Biology, and Anthropology), and is trying to clarify how we humans lost our tails evolutionarily and developmentally.
