## Dining in Edinburgh -

- Number One (0.5 miles) at the Balmoral Hotel a 4 AA Rosette Restaurant where modern Scottish cuisine meets world-class service; fine dining, tasting menu
- Brasserie Prince-(0.5 miles) at the Balmoral Hotel chic, relaxed restaurant, marrying classic French cuisine with sublime Scottish produce
- Hawksmoor (0.4 miles), 23 W Register St Will Beckett and Huw Gott, the childhood friends behind Hawksmoor, opened their Edinburgh outlet in the banking hall of the former Royal Bank of Scotland headquarters, on the ground floor of The Edinburgh Grand in 2018. The menu features seafood from around the coast and beef from grass-fed native-breed cattle. For parties of 9 or more, the sharing platter is often a must!
- The Dome (0.2miles) 14 George St, One of the city's landmark buildings, it was first built as the headquarters of the Commercial Bank of Scotland in 1847. At this time, the city was undergoing a transformation as the classical New Town came to fruition. Corinthian columns, marble bars and a stunning dome all feature.
- Wedgwood the Restaurant (0.9miles) 267 Canongate, Royal Mile An intimate restaurant offering a mix of French and Scottish cuisine by the talented chef-owner, Paul Wedgewood. In addition to an a la carte offering, there is a 'wee tour of Scotland' tasting menu.
- **Six by Nico (**0.2miles) **97 Hanover St, -** Experience a very competitively priced six-course tasting menu inspired by a theme, destination or concept. The menu changes every six weeks. Hugely popular with Edinburgh residents!
- <u>Luckenbooths</u> (0.6miles) 329 High Street, The Royal Mile Offering all-day casual dining.
- David Bann (0.9miles) **56-58 St Mary's St**, An intimate wee gem of a place that opened its door in 2002. It is considered by some to be the best vegetarian restaurant in Scotland. The menu is strictly vegetarian but as the cuisine is delicious, innovative and chic it attracts rave reviews even from non-vegetarians!
- Angels with Bagpipes (0.5miles) 343 High St, Royal Mile An independent family restaurant since 2010. They pride themselves on sourcing fresh ingredients from the country's stunning natural larder offering a modern Scottish seasonal menu throughout the day. The scallops with Stornoway black pudding are delicious!
- Deacon Brodie's Tavern (0.5miles) High Street, Royal Mile Named after
  Deacon Brodie, Robert Louis Stevenson's muse for his infamous book, Strange

Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde. Like many pub-goers, Brodie was a respectable citizen by day but a drinker by night. He also gambled, which resulted in him turning to burglary and a life of crime including housebreaking to cover his debts. Brodie was caught and sentenced to death at the Tolbooth in 1788. The offering is traditional pub fayre and there is an extensive selection of whisky and good craft ales.

- Whighams (0.4miles) 13 Hope St, Whighams is steeped in history and over time, the cellars evolved as a wholesale wine merchant, bottling from wooden barrels for many years, supplying wine to Edinburgh's gentry from the prestigious Charlotte Square in the city's New Town. Widely considered to be the city's most popular wine bar. The menu has a seafood focus.
- Contini George Street (0.1 miles) George Street Modern Italian Dining in a stunning Edinburgh 19th century banking hall
