<b>Major Hazards and Risks:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>➤ <b>Day 1 (much like a transition day)</b></li><li>➤ <b>Elevation and Dehydration</b></li><li>➤ <b>Night Activities</b></li><li>➤ <b>Driving Hazards</b></li><li>➤ <b>Unrehearsed Medical Response</b></li></ul>		
<p style="text-align: center;"><b><i>Day 1 is much like a Transition Day</i></b></p> <p>Spend some time this morning gaining your situational awareness just like you would on an incident. Who are you working for (instructor), where are you working (what classroom), how do I get there, what are the primary hazards I may encounter (wildlife crossing the road, turning on or off of Hwy 82 with high speed, blind driveways &amp; bicyclists on Spring Valley Road, high elevation &amp; dehydration, and what will I do if I encounter an emergency situation. You should work to mitigate these hazards to an acceptable level before you engage.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><i>Elevation and Dehydration</i></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The college campus sits at 6,916' so take your time and watch for symptoms of elevation sickness; light headed or a head ache. Stay hydrated even if you don't think your thirsty.</li><li>• Enjoy your cup of coffee, but don't over do it.</li></ul> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><i>Night Activities</i></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Be responsible when you are out and have a plan. Have a designated driver if you plan to have adult beverages.</li></ul> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><i>Driving and Wildlife</i></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Expect to encounter deer or elk.</li><li>• Heavy tourist traffic in Glenwood Springs and Carbondale that will be distracted by the beautiful mountain scenery. Plan for 15-minute delays getting through Glenwood at night.</li><li>• Give yourself plenty of time when turning on or off of Hwy 82 and watch for bicyclists and hidden driveways on Spring Valley Road. Use 114 to turn south onto Hwy 82 as there is light.</li></ul> <p style="text-align: center;"><b><i>“What will you do if someone gets hurt?” – Remember Andy Palmer</i></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Medical emergencies can occur at any time – don't get caught unprepared.<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Take time to review the medical plan and medical incident report.</li><li>○ Know where the closet medical equipment, personnel and medivac spot at all times.</li><li>○ When did you and your crew last train with an Incident Within an Incident (IWI)?</li><li>○ If you have a medical, law, or fire emergency, call 911 and then notify your chain of command.</li></ul></li></ul> <p style="text-align: right;">Safety Officers: David Vitwar SOFC, Steve Peck SOF3t, Karen Dickson SOF3t</p>
